

### STUDENT OPPORTUNITIES AND INDUSTRY EXPERIENCE

In 2025, Wakakirri expanded its student engagement initiatives, providing valuable industry experience in the performing arts. Through the **Work Placement and Mentor Programs,** students participated in live events across Australia, gaining hands-on experience in stage management, lighting, sound, and digital content creation.

In Victoria, the Youth Committee & Mentor Program offered students tailored guidance and professional insight into the creative process and event production.

Additionally, ten students from across the country cohosted the Wakakirri Season Wrap-Up TV Special, developing on-camera presentation and communication skills.

### **SCHOOL SUPPORT PROGRAMS**

The AIR Program delivered flexible, in-school workshops tailored to each school's needs, while the Free Story-Dance Program provided new schools with ready-to-use resources to confidently create their first Story-Dance.

# CASE STUDY

## MAYFIELD EAST PRESENTS "PEACE FOR POLINA"

Over the past two years, our students have studied the impact of war on children through compelling texts, and the stories they encountered left a deep impression. When the 2025 Wakakirri theme, "Tales of Inner Strength", was announced, they chose to explore this urgent theme — but in a way that was real, not imagined. Rather than creating a fabricated version of war, they were determined to share the true story of a child living through it — a child who, despite fear and loss, continues to fight for change.

This led them to Polina, a 10-year-old girl from Ukraine whose world was torn apart by the war. In the face of unimaginable trauma, she continues to dream of becoming a veterinarian and already cares for animals displaced by the conflict. With the help of Newcastle filmmakers Shane and Agnes Burrell, our students connected with Polina's story, which gave them not only something to dance for, but something to stand for.

In shaping their performance, students also wanted to highlight the universal rights of children everywhere — the right to safety, education, healthcare, and the simple joy of growing up without fear. Their vision was to create a piece that was powerful and moving, one that would evoke empathy in the audience and inspire a call for change. Through dance and drama, students created a story showing two girls, the same age, living parallel lives worlds apart: one wakes to peace in Australia, the other to conflict and fear in Ukraine. Divided by fate, their day unfolds in stark contrast, highlighting the vast differences between their worlds while revealing their shared hopes and dreams.





Being part of Wakakirri for the first time has given our students a meaningful stage to shine, to share their voices, and to feel the deep pride and joy that comes from creating something together that truly matters. Polina's story touched their hearts. They didn't just want to tell a story, they wanted to make a real impact. Through their Peace for Polina Day, the whole school community and local businesses came together to raise awareness and funds to support Polina's education and future.

Their efforts, which received recognition from local radio, newspapers, and the Department of Education, raised nearly \$3,000, which went directly to Polina to help her achieve her dream of becoming a veterinarian. Students were astounded by the positivity, support, and encouragement from the entire school community, and were beyond thrilled to be invited to attend the Wakakirri Award Show at NIDA, where they were recognised with a state award. Wakakirri has shown students that they have the power to create change. Many say it has changed their lives forever, giving them immense gratitude for living in a country free from war and inspiring them to advocate for peace and justice for children like Polina. They have also discovered firsthand that art has the power to connect, challenge, confront, inspire, and create meaningful change.



# WAKAKIRRI ASSOCIATION INC.


